Cassowary Coast Welcomes New Council and First Female Mayor

Cassowary Coast Regional Council welcomed the region's first female Mayor Teresa Millwood and nominated its Deputy Mayor Nicholas Pervan at this morning's post-election meeting held in Innisfail.

Alongside the declaration of office for Mayor Millwood were new Councillors Peter Reed (Division 1) and Ellen Jessop (Division 2), as well as returning Councillors Trudy Tschui (Division 3), Nicholas Pervan (Division 4), Jeff Baines (Division 5) and Renee McLeod (Division 6).

Mayor Millwood congratulated her fellow Councillors on their appointments and said she's looking forward to working with Council to deliver priorities for the community.

"We need to get back to essential services and provide value for money so that our community is satisfied that they're receiving the services they're paying for," Mayor Millwood said.

New Study Hub Brings Higher Education to Innisfail

The Cassowary Coast region is poised for a significant advancement in higher education accessibility with the announcement of funding for a regional university study hub in Innisfail, spearheaded by community-based organisation Vocational Partnerships Group (VPG).

Innisfail will soon be among the proud hosts of ten new Regional University Study Hubs across Australia, after a \$16 million investment from the Federal Government aimed at providing more students from small towns access to tertiary education.

Maryanne Tranter, VPG Chief Executive Officer, expressed her elation at the announcement.

"This is an incredibly exciting time for the Cassowary Coast community.

"With the establishment of this study hub, locals will have the opportunity to pursue their higher education dreams confidently, knowing that they have the support and resources readily available to help them achieve their academic goals."

Construction of Revitalised Mission Beach Town Centre to Commence

Cassowary Coast Regional Council is pleased to announce that construction is scheduled to commence in April 2024 on the Mission Beach Town Centre Revitalisation Project. It is envisaged that this project will transform the Mission Beach town centre through infrastructure roads, drainage, landscaping, and lighting.

The construction contract has been awarded to RMS Engineering and Construction Pty Ltd. Construction is scheduled for completion in the second quarter of 2025.

The \$18.98 million Mission Beach Town Centre Revitalisation Project includes the upgrade of ageing stormwater infrastructure and redevelopment of the Mission Beach Village Green and adjacent Porter Promenade.

Reports of Croc Sighting at Kurrimine Beach

The Department of Environment and Science have advised Council that Wildlife Officers have deployed sighting signs after recent reports of approx. 3m saltwater crocodile was spotted in Kurrimine Beach.

Sightings have been reported near the Maria Creek boat ramp and along the beach foreshore.

South Mission Beach is half way through its sand nourishment program with 3,600t of sand recently transferred to site offering valuable protection to the foreshore during recent king tides.

An added bonus is that nature gave us a helping hand in naturally compacting and re-settling the new sand to offer our community a newly nourished beach.

The remainder of the works will soon commence with an overall 6,250t of sand to be delivered for this program.

No. 6 Branch Road Closure on behalf of MSF

Council wishes to advise on behalf of MSF, No 6 Branch Road will undergo a temporary closure for approximately 10 weeks, from April 9th to June 21st, 2024.

During this period, there will be a full road closure with a single-lane side track under Give Way Signage to facilitate the replacement of the rail crossing on No.6 Branch Road.

The Speed limit will be reduced to 40km/h for the safety of the community. Please travel with caution and be mindful of the signs in place.
